Purpose	Add, review, and maintain current and past client diagnosis records using ICD-10 codes.
Who should do this	CAREWare users who are authorized to enter or review client clinical information.
Use this guide when you need to	Add a diagnosis, update diagnosis details, or review active diagnoses for a client.
Main warning	Select the correct diagnosis status. Only records marked Active appear in the Active Diagnoses list.

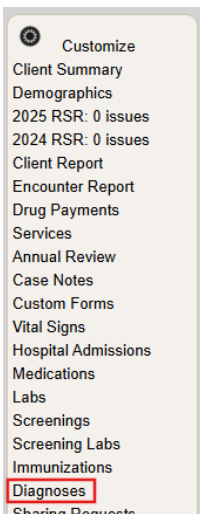

Before you begin

- Open the correct client record.
- Confirm that ICD-10 diagnosis codes have been activated under Clinical Setup.
- Confirm that your user account has permission to add or update diagnosis records.

Add a diagnosis to a client record

Step 1. Click Diagnoses in the client record menu.**Step 2.** Click All Diagnoses.

Step 3. Click Add.

Add	Creates a new diagnosis record.	Use when entering a diagnosis for the client.
Delete	Deletes an existing diagnosis record.	Use only when a record should be removed.
Back	Returns to the Client Diagnoses menu.	Use when leaving the All Diagnoses list.
Print or Export	Prints or exports the diagnosis list.	Use when a printed or exported list is needed.
Column Visibility	Changes which columns appear in the list.	Use to customize the diagnosis list display.

Troubleshooting and common questions

Why does a diagnosis not appear in Active Diagnoses?

Confirm that the diagnosis Status is set to Active. Inactive and Resolved records remain available under All Diagnoses.

How can I find a diagnosis code?

Search the ICD10 Code/Description box by diagnosis name or ICD-10 code, then select the correct result.
