

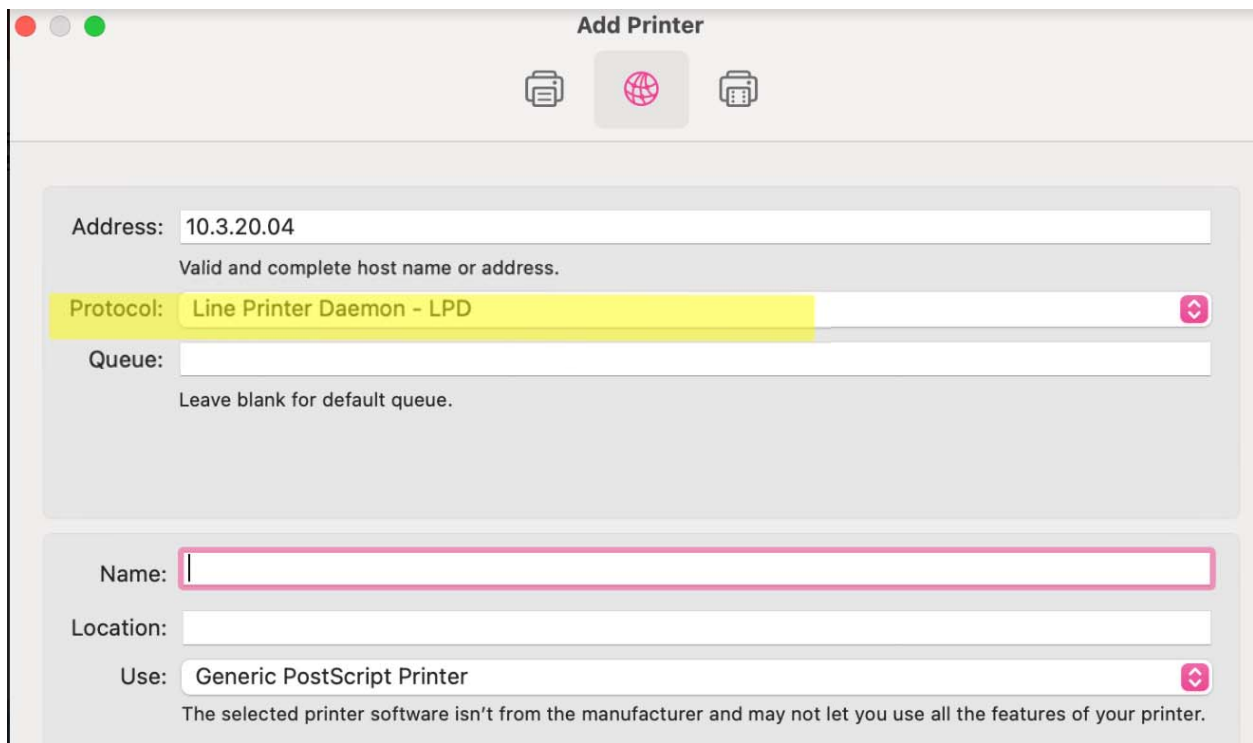
Adding Printers to a Mac.

Open System Preferences

Select Printers

Select the + to add printers

Click on the Globe to add the printer by IP address.
